

Village Hall Report to the Kilve Parish Assembly April 2013

The Village Hall has had another successful year. Coffee mornings have increased in popularity, the numbers increasing each month; we now have an average attendance of 40 people. The 100 club continues to bring in a regular income to the hall, this year it raised almost £900, this is an important fund raiser and we encourage all villagers to take part to help keep the hall in a secure financial position.

We have had an improvement grant from the lottery which enabled us to install a new sound system and hearing loop, this has made a huge difference to the listening experience in the hall. Somerset Community Fund and EDF gave us grants to improve the kitchen which has enabled us to start the Luncheon Club. The Luncheon Club has been running for 4 months and so far has been a great success with 17 volunteers involved in total. 6 volunteers took the food safety level 2 course and passed. Each month we serve up to 25 local residents a two course meals and coffee for £5. It is a great social event that has been very well supported and received.

Film Night declined in popularity and has been suspended for the present time, we intend showing films on an adhoc basis in the future.

The March Madness show was a great success, we sold over 100 tickets, it was a truly memorable evening thanks to everyone who took part.

The Village Hall Committee wish to thank everyone for their support both by attending events and giving of their time, without it the hall would stagnate and become uneconomic.
